2. April 25, 2015. Household goods, 1994 Cadillac and Gentlemen Jim Chev or GMC pickup. The sale starts at 9:30 AM.










## Tech Tip.....

- ADJUSTING BRAKES ON THE MODEL 'A'
- I am sure we can find a dozen ways to adjust brakes.
- The way I have on my cars is as follows.
- Always adjust brakes when they are cold.
- 1. Jack up car and place on proper jack stands. All 4 wheels. Safety First.
- 2. Remove all four wheel brake clevis rods at the wheel end.
- 3. Rotate tire until tight with brake wedge. Back off for slight drag on all 4 wheels.
- 4. Adjust brake rod clevis to fit back of wheel drums.


