Tech Tip.....

Carburetor Float Wear

With the considerable use of today's Model 'A', our carburetors may have developed a gas leak. This may be caused by a dimple being worn in the top of the float by the valve needle. A remedy is to blend out the ridges of the dimple by sanding from the back by hand, them buffing the float. If done properly, the valve will close to stop the leak. "Ah-ooh-ga" Ed

- •••Nebraska was the only state admitted to the union under a Presidential veto. Andrew Johnson's veto was overridden by Congress and President Johnson proclaimed Nebraska a state.
- •••The first governor of Nebraska was David Butler, who won the election over J. Sterling Morton by only 109 votes. An election official took the ballot box home for supper and those votes were considered invalid.
- ••••David Butler was the only governor who has been impeached. (March 1, 1871) He took money from the states school fund to help build a hotel.
- •••In 1867, Lincoln police officers worked 7 days per week. There were 2 shifts, the day force and the night force.






