Tech Tip

MODEL A FORD HORN REPAIR (Reprinted from Model A Times) Lubrication: Once a month, remove motor cover located at rear of horn and place a few drops of oil in grove at each end of the armature shaft. Yeah, I bet you do that all the time! Use a light fine oil.

Clean the commutator: Set the motor in motion by pressing the horn button. While the motor is revolving, hold a piece of fine sandpaper against the commutator until commutator is clean. Next, with a small piece of wood, clean the gaps between the commutator segments. Another operation you have probably skipped of the years! Do not use metal when cleaning gaps. When turned with the fingers, the armature should revolve freely. Should it fail to operate, examine the battery, the wiring and the horn button.

Adjustment: Turning the adjusting screw regulates the tone. Turning the screw to the right tightens the adjustment. Turning to the left loosens it. Regulate the adjustment until the desired tone is obtained. Sometimes you need to let the expert repair the horn.






ALL FORD SHOW AT ANDERSON FORD ~ July 11th
