The time is drawing near to store our Model As for it's Long Winter Nap.

One thing we all need to be aware of is the use of the newer type of Anti freeze. Most recent technology (OAT) organic acid technology Antifreeze (such as Dex-Cool) may not be compatible with conventional inorganic based coolant containing glycol.

Look for conventional inorganic coolants (blue or green) in color.

Caution: Both the original OAT and the newer "universal -type" OAT coolants can cause severe damage to older radiators not specifically designed for it's use. Stay away from red, orange and pink Antifreeze.




