




Breakfast Meeting

After the transplant, he will be an inpatient at UNMC for about 3 weeks, depending how things are going. Then he will need to stay within 30 min of Omaha for 80 or more days with careful observation for graft vs host disease. February 20, 2016 Cornhusker Model A Club Meeting Minute

He shared the transportation evolution from walking and horseback riding to motorcycles and automobiles as well has the weapons evolution from lowly billy clubs to guns. 


