The text with the wrench read: "The object of the invention is to provide a single and newly improved wrench for those parts of an automobile requiring the most frequent manipulation. It can be adapted for fitting both old and new Ford automobiles and trucks." Value: \$20. The maker of the wrench is the Barcalo Manufacturing Co. of Buffalo, NY. Started in 1896 by Edward J Barcalo. He become successful by selling tools through distributors to hardware stores and through automobile catalogs.






