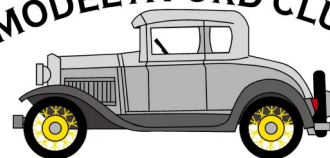

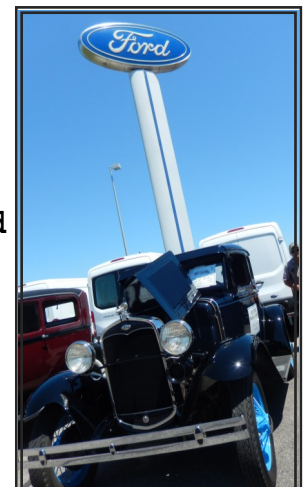


ALL FORD SHOW

The Douglas County Historical Society and the Meadowlark Model A Ford Club are hosting the Vintage Wheels at the Fort Car Show again this year. The event will take place on Sunday, August 20, 2017 at the Metropolitan Community College Fort Omaha Campus at 30th and Fort Street. This will be the fourth year for this fun day at the Fort for the entire family and it is planned to be the best yet. All vintage cars and trucks at least 50 years old (pre-1968) and in original or restored original condition are welcome.
