

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Benjamin Franklin gets some credit for the idea of daylight saving time though his recommendation was really a joke. In a letter to the editor of the "Journal of Paris," Franklin jokingly recommended that people get out of bed earlier in the morning to minimize the use of candles and lamp oil. He never mentioned setting clocks back and forth.

It was during WWI that daylight saving time was first practically used. In 1916, locations within the German Empire set clocks ahead an hour in an effort to save fuel for lighting and to save fuel for the war effort. After the was ended, standard time resumed.

In the United States, daylight saving time was first used in 1918 when a bill introduced the idea of a seasonal time shift. It lasted seven months before the bill was repealed.

During WWII, President Franklin Roosevelt re-established the idea of daylight saving time. It was called "War Time." It began in Feb. 1942 and lasted until the end of Sept. 1945. In 1966, the Uniform Time Act of 1966 established the idea of regulating a yearly time change. Daylight saving time would begin the last Sunday in April and end the last Sunday in October. Since then, there have been several changes in the start and end dates.

Nebraskans started using daylight saving time on April 26, 1970.

Hawaii and Arizona are the only states not participating in daylight saving time.
