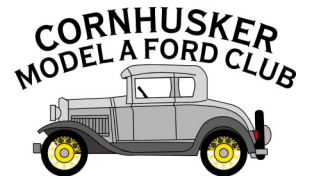

APRIL MAFFI Newsletter Minute

For starters, a little history of the Model A Foundation, Inc. In 1984, trustees of the Model A Ford Club of America (MAFCA) began to discuss formation of a foundation with tax-exempt, charitable status. By 1987, a separate organization, MAFFI was officially recognized, with the goal of building a museum dedicated to the preservation of the Model A Ford car and related items of the era. The foundation grew and developed plans to build, and finally settled on the Gilmore location. The current building was completed in the fall of 2012, and the Grand opening was held in May, 2013.

Membership has steadily grown, and MAFFI has not had an increase in dues since well before the Museum existed. However, the cost of operating the Museum has continued to rise. The MAFFI Board of Trustees, in careful consideration of all the facts, has voted to implement the following dues structure, **effective May 1, 2023**. Note that each membership includes the named member and spouse/domestic partner.

Annual Dues - \$35 3 year membership - \$100 Lifetime Membership - \$500

Please note that MAFFI is the only partner museum at the Gilmore that offers a Lifetime membership, and... we maintain the lowest annual dues on the campus. Consider the many benefits that MAFFI membership brings, in particular... Paid members enjoy free admission to the Gilmore Car Museum all year. This alone is worth the cost of dues. 2023 NEBRASKA HISTORICAL LUNCH SERIES

This season's series will spotlight the institutions that make Lincoln the Star City. Learn about the history of Lincoln's city government, our public school system, city library system, our oldest hospital, the police department and the changes in our demographics over time.

Wednesday, May 17: Built for Learning: A history of Lincoln Public Schools, presented by Ed Zimmer

From the original Lincoln High School of 1871 to the new high schools opening in 2022 (Northwest) and in 2023 (Standing Bear). Lincoln Public Schools have a rich history of growing with the community. Ed Zimmer will trace the history through images and stories spanning 150 years.

Wednesday, June 21: What's In A Name: A short History of Lincoln City Libraries and its Namesakes, presented by Kimberly Shelley

Do you know who Charles W. Gere was? Bess Dodson Walt? Victor E Anderson? Learn about the individuals for whom Lincoln City Libraries were named as well how Lincoln City Libraries has evolved and grown during the past 150 years.

Wednesday, July 19: Lincoln's First Hospital: A Journey Through Time, presented by Donna Hammack and Michael Bingeman

Michael and Donna's presentation will span the establishment of St. Elizabeth in 1889 at the Buckstaff Residence to the present day St. Elizabeth, a regional medical center located on South 70th Street. They will explain the origin of the name and the multitude of changes that have occurred over time.

Wednesday, August 16: History of the Lincoln Police Department, presented by Joy Citta and Jason Hellmuth

Joy and Jason will give a history of the Lincoln Police Department from the 1870s, when there are only three police officers, to the present when primary police services in Lincoln are delivered by over 200 officers.

Wednesday, September 20 – Lincoln's Changing Demographics, presented by Mary Sauers

From pioneer times to the present, Lincoln's demographics have changed significantly, particularly with the influx of immigrants throughout our history. Mary will explain those changes according to Lincoln's census information.
